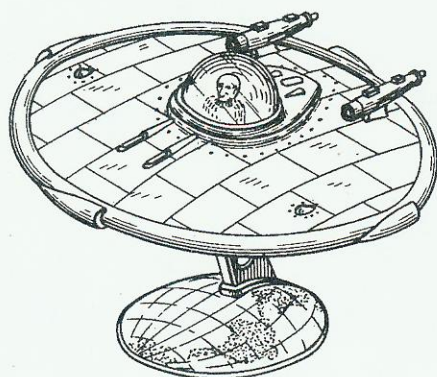

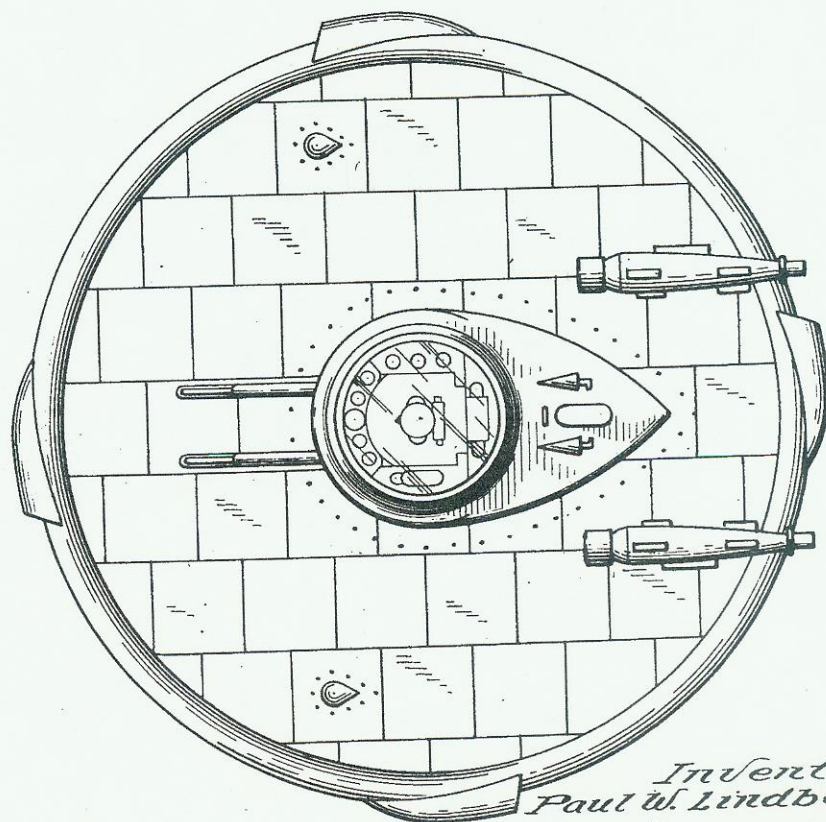

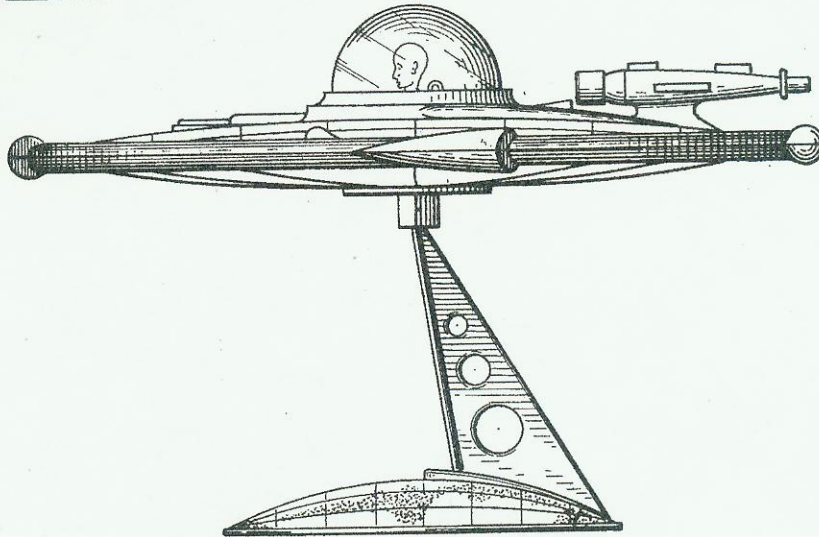
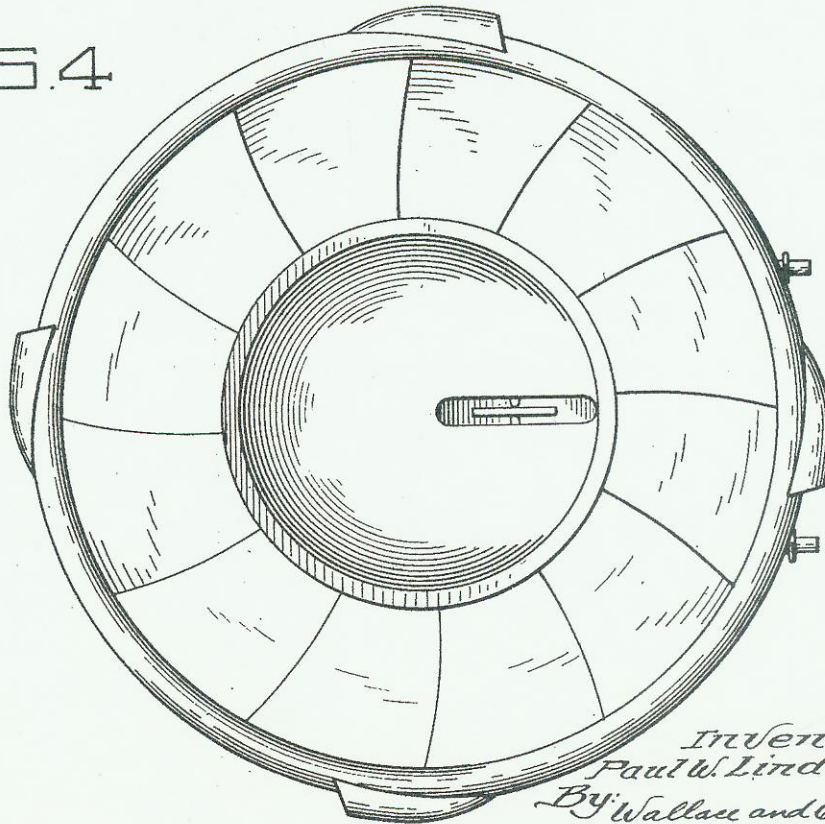

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Paul W. Lindberg, a citizen of the United States, residing at Highland Park, in the county of Lake and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Toy Space Ship, of which the following is a specification, reference being made to the accompanying drawings, forming a part hereof.

In the drawings:

Fig. 1 is a perspective view of a toy space ship embodying my new design;

Fig. 2 is an enlarged top plan view thereof;

Fig. 3 is a side elevational view thereof; and

Fig. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof.

Portions of the drawing figures are diagonally lined to indicate transparency.
